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1. Community Services and Contribution of Budokan Judo Club

Budokan Judo Club has built up over 10 years to what it is today. Originally a club of 10 members with one instructor offering two sessions per week, to a vibrant family-based club that is run by two international-level coaching coordinators and assisted by a number of qualified coaches running 5-6 sessions per week for over 100 registered members (FY10/11) aged 5 to 65 years. The club is incorporated under the Associations Act and all those contributing to its activities are volunteers who act for the good of the local community. In summary, the club contributes to the local and the Judo communities in the following manner:

- Budokan Judo Club facilitates the development of children into responsible and disciplined young adults via one of the most physical and challenging sports available.
- Judo is widely acclaimed to have benefits to people with disabilities. Budokan Judo club trains athletes with hearing and sight impediments, and with developmental disorders like ADHD and Aspergers Syndrome. Some of our athletes who fit into these categories have represented Australia at World Championship level. Parents of these members have reported that the club has improved their focus, provided a greater level of self-confidence and self-worth and has actually improved their ability to cope with their condition. We also coach members with hearing and sight impediments. The contribution and value of the club to community members with various impairments is abundantly clear. Refer to the following site:

- Budokan Judo Club promotes the Olympic Sport of Judo and the active and healthy lifestyle lead by its club members within the Hills Shire and beyond via regular media coverage in local newspapers and community radio on the achievements of its elite athletes.
- The club provides a safe environment for the community's youth to express themselves physically and in a controlled and focused manner, in effect providing an outlet which mitigates risk associated with youth on the streets. It also provides females with confidence and assertiveness as a first line defence if faced with confrontational situations and provides physical skills useful to personnel involved in policing, fire, ambulance and military services amongst others, some of our members belonging to these services. - Budokan Judo Club has run Judo programs for local school physical education system providing a benefit to students and the schools. Most recently, in cooperation with Model Farms High School we ran Judo programs for two terms including Years 11 and 12 during 2011. It is intended to continue with this program and expand it across other local primary and high schools, again for obvious mutual benefit.
- The demographics of the members of Budokan Judo Club is as vast as a small population, from families with lawyers, doctors, and engineers to electricians, plumbers and builders, to single parents with financially challenged families, all of whom enjoy the spirit and equity which the club provides. In the Judo club, there are over 15 families with more than one family member in the club. This means that the club becomes more than just a sport for a child or a child-minding facility as is the case with many sporting clubs, but rather a source of quality family time, a reason for combining a family holiday with an interstate competition, and a strong social network with other families.
- Budokan Judo Club is currently working with The NW Rail Link Project, The Hills Shire Council, the Local Member for castle Hill, and State Government to minimise the impact of the Rail Link Project and maximise the benefit to the club so that the community services provided by Budokan Judo Club and its sister clubs occupying the Horticulture Pavilion can be preserved.
- Budokan Judo Club offers avenues for state and national representation through to Commonwealth and Olympic level. The club is a conduit for athletes with drive and motivation to achieve greatness by representing their country. This year alone, we have achieved selection of 4 athletes in 5 categories at the Oceania Continental

Union Championships in Tahiti where they achieved 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 2 Bronze medals. We also had 19 athletes represent NSW in 25 categories at the 2011 National Championships where they won 17 medals: 4 Gold, 8 Silver and 5 Bronze, more than any other club in NSW which had the highest medal tally and more than 3 other States. A consequence of these results was selection of 4 athletes to the Cadet World Championships in Ukraine, 2 of which competed, selection of 2 athletes to the Junior Men/Women World Championships in South Africa, and selection of 2 senior athletes to the Olympic qualifying event, the World Cup in Samoa.

- Budokan has contributed over \$7000 in assistance to over 30 athletes and coaches: athletes who have represented their club in State events, represented NSW at National Championships, represented Australia internationally, or because they are National NTID Squad members, whose club training is sponsored; and coaches who have participated at these events or who have updated their coaching qualifications. This investment reaps rewards and must be maintained.
- Budokan's coaches comprise State and National coaches, the NSW National Coaching Accreditation Scheme (NCAS) Coordinator, the NSW National Talent Identification and Development (NTID) Coordinator, BBR NSW Kata Instructor and National Kata judge. In the last 2 years we have also had within the club the JFA(NSW) Competition Volunteer Coordinator and the NSW State Team Manager. We have a consistent response to requests for volunteers at all competitions, most recently 4 for the NSW Open and assist in recommending and implementing improvements to competition management and other State initiatives, such as "Club of Excellence". We are also developing strategies to create interest in refereeing and Kata as streams for athletes who are less interested in competition. Kerrye and Rob Katz continue to run the State Squad sessions with Phil Kearney on Saturdays 3.00-5.00pm.

2. About Budokan, the club

Budokan's values are demonstrated by our mission and vision as described below. As one of the most successful Judo training centres in Australia (NSW was the premier State in terms of results at the 2011 National Championships and Budokan had the highest medal tally of any NSW club), Budokan is home to a number of state, national and international Judokas as well as a large number of recreation players from ages 5 to 65. Our coaches encourage and acknowledge participation at every level and we really care for and support all our athletes regardless of their goals. Because of that, we have high levels of participation in competition and this improves the depth of experience and technical knowledge of our competitors. In turn this results in improved competitiveness and results. We also have many athletes who do not compete but enjoy the aspects of education, fitness, and skill development. We have two coaching coordinators who have 80 years of experience between them having competed and coached to Olympic Games level themselves.
